

## 2010 INTERNATIONAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

### University Requirements

#### Aptitude

Freshmen must have a 3.0 grade point average (GPA) (a B or better where 4.0 = A) from a secondary school. Transfers must have a minimum 2.5 GPA (a C+ or better where 4.0 = A) from a college or university. International students do not need to take the ACT or SAT tests for entrance to ASU. However, an ACT or SAT score may be required for entrance into some colleges/schools.

#### English Proficiency

Applicants whose native language is not English (identified by the U.S. Department of State Bureau of Public Affairs) must provide evidence of English language proficiency. See How to Apply for acceptable documentation. The English proficiency requirement may be fulfilled by meeting one of the following:

- Minimum score of 500 (paper-based), 173 (computer-based) or 61 iBT (Internet-based) on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) for general admission to the university **OR**
- Minimum overall band of 6.0 with no band below 5.5 on the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) **OR**
- Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university in the United States **OR**
- 48 transferable semester credits from a U.S. college or university including two semesters (six credits) of freshman composition that satisfy ASU's first-year composition requirement, with a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher **OR**
- Completion of four years of U.S. high school and high school competency requirement\* met **OR**
- SAT Verbal score of 550 or an ACT English score of 23 after attending junior and senior years of a U.S. high school **OR**
- Completion of the Advanced level 2 of the American English and Culture Program (AECP) at Arizona State University and have a recommendation from the ASU AECP director. ASU AECP offers a specially designed, intensive English language instruction on ASU's Tempe campus.

#### HOW TO APPLY

#### 1 International Student Application for Undergraduate Admission

- Apply online at [www.asu.edu/apply](http://www.asu.edu/apply) or complete and sign the application on the last page. You must provide your home-country physical address (no P.O. boxes) and your mailing address.
- Include a non-refundable application fee (\$55 for Spring and Summer 2010; \$65 for Fall 2010) in U.S. dollars in the form of a check or money order drawn from a U.S. bank or U.S. banking affiliate and made payable to Arizona State University. Do not send cash or international postal money orders. Application fees cannot be waived or transferred to another application.

#### 2 Certified copies of official documents from each secondary school, college, university and/or technical schools attended

Records must include courses completed, grades or marks earned, and certificates or degrees awarded. Include a certified English translation of all documents not written in English. Official documents include:

- Original academic credentials issued by the registrar of the institution attended, bearing the original raised or colored seal of the institution and the signature of the institution's registrar, academic official, or recognized international organization.
- Photocopies of academic credentials that have been verified as true copies of the original by a responsible official of the institution attended or by an educational representative of the country's government or embassy. Each page must bear the verifying official's signature and stamp.
- Photocopies of international academic credentials on file with the registrar of an institution you previously attended in the United States.
- Photocopies of academic credentials that have been certified by a recognized international educational organization – such as the U.S. Educational Foundation, AMIDEAST or the Institute for International Education.

Note: photocopies certified by a notary public are not official.

#### 3 English proficiency documentation

Submit one of the following. See English Proficiency under University Requirements.

- Official TOEFL score report sent directly to ASU from TOEFL Services.
- Official International English Language Testing System (IELTS) score report sent directly to ASU from the IELTS Office.
- Transcript sent directly from a regionally accredited college or university in the United States.
- Transcript sent directly from a U.S. high school.
- Recommendation letter from the AECP director.

#### 4 Financial Guarantee

In compliance with the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) regulation, all international applicants on the F-1 (student) or J-1 (exchange) visa must provide evidence of sufficient funds available for their studies. See Estimate of Expenses below.

The Financial Guarantee, dated within the past six months, must be co-signed by an authorized bank official or representative of a recognized sponsoring agency located in the United States. A form for the Financial Guarantee can be found at [students.asu.edu/international-admission](http://students.asu.edu/international-admission). An Affidavit of Support cannot be used in lieu of a bank statement.

Additional fees are required for summer session.

This estimate of expenses is for a single student only. Students accompanied by a spouse must anticipate additional living expenses of approximately \$4,000 annually. An additional \$3,000 is required for each child. Medical insurance: ASU requires that all international students have health and accident insurance; the cost of insurance is automatically added to your registration billing. ## ASU UNDERGRADUATE DEGREES AND MAJOR FIELDS OF STUDY

### PROCEDURES, VISAS, IMMIGRATION

- Admission to ASU cannot be determined until your file is complete and all of your credentials are evaluated. See How to Apply on the previous page.
- Your SEVIS I-20 (Certificate of Eligibility for Non-Immigrant Student Status), essential for securing an F-1 student visa, will be forwarded to you if you are admitted to ASU. Keep your SEVIS I-20 in a secure place; ASU will not issue a second SEVIS I-20.
- Take your SEVIS I-20 and letter of admission to the nearest U.S. Embassy to apply for a student visa.
- Arrive at ASU no later than one week before classes begin according to the information on the SEVIS I-20. ASU cannot authorize you to arrive later or change the information on your SEVIS I-20.
- When arriving in the United States, show your SEVIS I-20 and your letter of admission to the U.S. customs/immigration officials at the airport.
- If you are a transfer student already in the United States, inform your school's international student advisor of your transfer plan. It is necessary to transfer your SEVIS information from your current institution to ASU to receive a new I-20. Meet with an advisor at your current school and complete a SEVIS Transfer Form to determine an appropriate date to transfer to ASU. ASU's school code is PH0214F00127000. When you are admitted to ASU, your SEVIS I-20 will be issued after the release date indicated by your school. When you arrive at ASU, pick up your new SEVIS I-20 from Undergraduate Admissions, then report to the International Student Office.
- Students holding F-2 visas cannot attend ASU on a full-time basis.
- Measles immunization: You must complete the measles immunization verification form you receive with your letter of admission before you can register for classes. Proof of two Measles (Rubeola), Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccinations, at least one of which you received after 1979, is required.
- You must enroll full-time each semester.
