The AHMP- Thunderbird Chapter will award three scholarships to students in graduate and undergraduate environmental programs in the Arizona:

- *One \$2,500 scholarship*
- *One \$1,500 scholarship*
- *One \$1,000 scholarship*

To qualify, you must:

- Be pursuing a career in the environmental field.
- Be an undergraduate or graduate student in an environmental-related program in Arizona, including but not limited to:
 - Hazardous materials technologies
 - Environmental engineering
 - Civil engineering with an environmental emphasis
 - Physical/natural sciences with an environmental emphasis, i.e., chemistry, geology, biology, etc.
- Have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and making satisfactory progress.
- Be a full or part-time student for the 2010 academic year.

Scholarship Award Certificates will be presented at the *Gatekeeper Regulatory Round-up Conference* in Scottsdale, Arizona on January 26-27, 2010. The award applicants and winners will be notified by the end of December 2009.

All scholarships include:

- Complementary one-year AHMP- Thunderbird Chapter membership
- Free attendance at the next annual Gatekeeper Regulatory Round-Up Conference
- Free monthly luncheon meetings.
- Winners will be encouraged to participate in Thunderbird Chapter activities and will be expected to speak on a topic of their studies at a monthly lunch meeting.

Funds will be administered through the university scholarship/student financial assistance departments for the spring semester, 2010.
