Acceptable Documents

The following is a list of acceptable documents to verify a student's citizenship, legal resident or other lawful immigration status for purposes of determining eligibility for in-state tuition. Documents may be emailed, mailed, or submitted in person. Documentation that is submitted via email or mail must be legible with no evidence of tampering.
